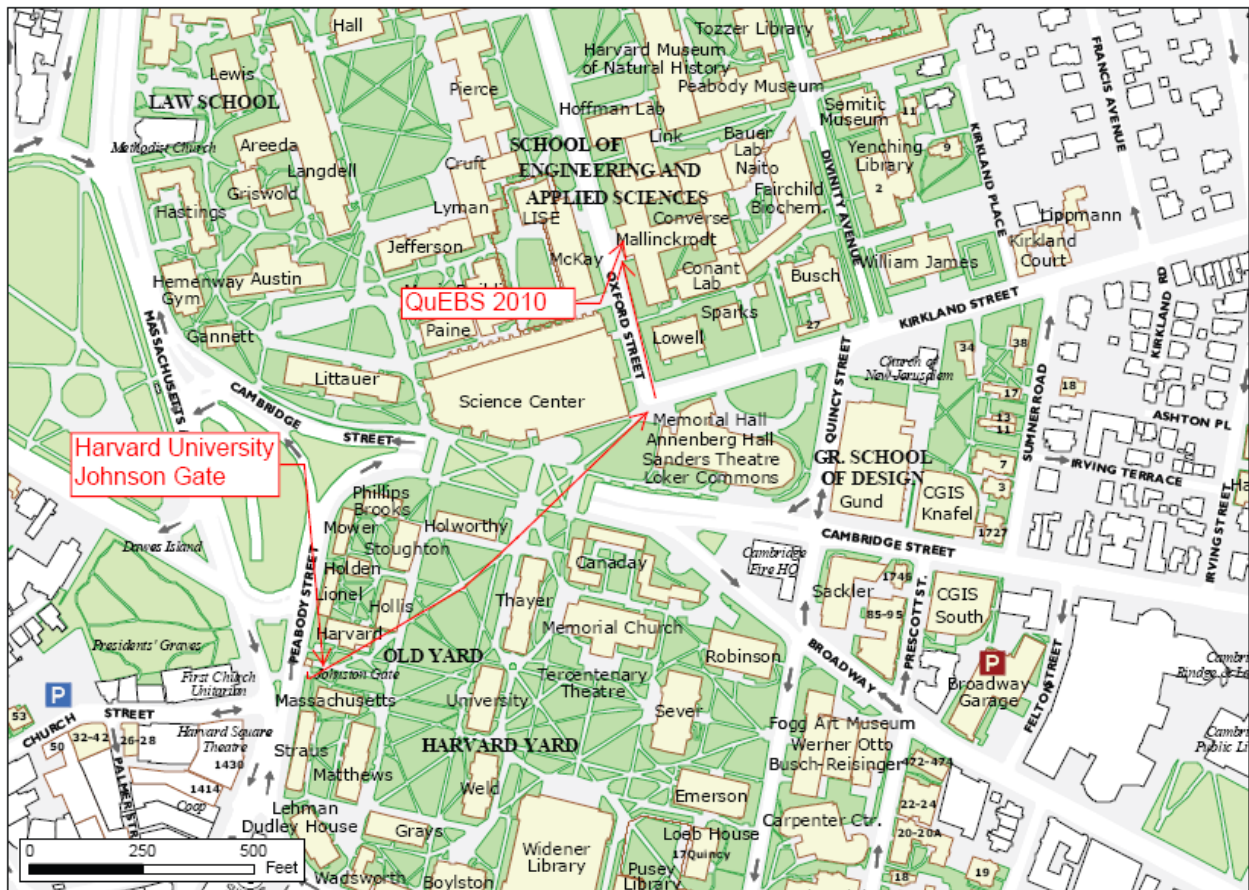

DIRECTIONS TO PFIZER LECTURE HALL

The QuEBS 2010 Workshop will be held at Pfizer Lecture Hall in Mallinckrodt Laboratory at 12 Oxford Street, Harvard University. Pfizer Lecture Hall is located on the ground floor of Mallinckrodt. In the main stairwell, go down one flight of stairs, through the double doors, take a right and walk to the end of the hallway. Signs will be throughout Mallinckrodt to direct you.



TRANSPORTATION TO/FROM THE HYATT REGENCY, CAMBRIDGE

A shuttle has been arranged to transport QuEBS 2010 Workshop participants staying at the Hyatt Regency, Cambridge hotel to Pfizer Lecture Hall at Mallinckrodt Laboratory, 12 Oxford Street. The shuttle will stop at the end of the Mallinckrodt building. Walk down the brick path under a second floor, gray walkway (the walkway connects the Mallinckrodt and Hoffman Laboratories). Enter through the second door (on the right) of the Mallinckrodt building.

ALTERNATIVE TRANSPORTATION TO THE QUEBS 2010 WORKSHOP

Visitors taking public transportation should travel to Harvard Square Station by either bus or the Red Line and then walk through the campus to Mallinckrodt Laboratory at 12 Oxford Street.

Walking from Harvard Square

Enter Harvard's campus by walking through Harvard Yard. Proceed straight through the main gate and walk down a diagonal path (walking on the left side of the campus) and through another gate. Proceed down another diagonal path (the Science Center will be on your left). Continue to a main road, Oxford Street. Cross the road. Walk up the stairs of the front entrance at 12 Oxford Street, Mallinckrodt Laboratory. Follow the signs to Pfizer Lecture Hall. The walk from the Square is about 10-minutes.

Arriving by subway

The MBTA - referred to as the "T" - runs daily service on buses, trains, & trolleys throughout Boston & surrounding towns. The closest stop to the conference site is "Harvard," on the red line (<http://www.mbta.com/>).

Arriving by air

The closest airport is Boston Logan International Airport BOS, located in Boston, MA. From this airport a free bus will take you to the "Airport" stop on the Blue Line. From there, you need to go to "Government Center," change to the Green Line, and at the next stop "Park Street," change to the Red Line. Get off at Harvard and follow the instructions from Harvard Square. A taxi from the airport may cost around \$40.

Arriving by train

Amtrak's South Station stop is conveniently located on the subway Red Line. You can take this and get off at Harvard, then follow the instructions from Harvard Square.

Arriving from MIT

Take the Number 1 bus on Massachusetts Avenue. Walk along the river towards the bridge (river on your right) and turn left on Massachusetts Avenue (away from the bridge). Get off at Harvard Square and follow the instructions from Harvard Square. Estimated travel time is about 15-20 minutes.

WIFI ACCESS AT HARVARD

Follow these step-by-step instructions to activate your XID Account by setting a permanent password. Once you have completed this process, you will be able to use your XID to access the website(s) for which the account was set up.

1. Click on this link:

2. At the prompt, enter your temporary secret key.

Your login id: Aspuru

Your temporary secret key: 7ynu6ysit8

3. You will then be prompted to enter a personal challenge question as well as enter a new permanent password. If you ever need to reset your password, you will need to remember the answer to this question.

4. You will receive on-screen confirmation that your XID has been activated.

Upon successfully completing the steps above you can use your XID at website(s) for which you have been configured. At the PIN System login screen, enter your login ID, and your new password. Both the login id and password are case sensitive. Be sure to select the [XID] radio button if multiple login types are available.
